## SOLAR IMPLICATIONS OF THE BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL



The Big Beautiful Bill will eliminate solar tax credits. However, the industry view is that **projects can preserve the tax credits by safe harbor**. The rules for this process will be defined by **August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025**.
